#### **Income Statement**

#### Q3 2006 vs Q3 2005

The Group recorded an increase in revenue of \$4.8 million or 9.6% for Q3 2006 to \$54.4 million as compared to Q3 2005. This comprises a revenue increase of \$5.5 million or 19.2% at the Mechatronics Division and a decline of \$0.7 million or 3.3% at the EMS Division, with the former comprising 62.2% of total revenue. At Mechatronics Division, the semiconductor segment out performed the others by registering robust growth of 129.0% with the medical segment showing modest growth while the analytical segment registered a slow down. The decline at the EMS Division was attributable to a slow down in the office automation segment with the keypad's segment remaining stable.

Although Group revenue increased by 9.6% to \$54.4 million, pre-tax profit increased by only 7% to \$8.6 million due mainly to the increase in administrative and general expenses by \$0.4 million or 15.7% as a result of additional staffing, higher staff incentive provision and increase in capacity at the Mechantronic's Division. However, despite the increase in revenue and pre-tax profit, the Group's profit after tax (PAT) decreased by 6.7% to \$6.3 million as compared to Q3 2005, mainly due to a higher effective tax rate arising from lower tax incentive claimed in the current quarter. Other factors which contributed to the decrease in PAT are as follows:

- a) Decrease in other gains by \$0.1 million or 17.1% mainly from lower government grants.
- b) Increase in other operating expenses by \$0.1 million or 107.2% mainly due to foreign exchange losses from inter company balances arising from the stronger Singapore Dollar to the Malaysian Ringgit.
- c) Decrease in share of profit of an associated company by \$0.1 million as the investment was disposed off in June 2006.

The decrease in PAT was mitigated by the following:

- i) Increase in gross profit by \$1.1 million or 9.7% from higher revenue achieved. The Group's gross profit margin remains stable; and
- ii) Lower finance costs from lower level of borrowings coupled with higher interest income from higher cumulative cash, totaling \$0.2 million.

### 9 months ended 2006 vs 9 months ended 2005

The Group recorded an increase in revenue of \$3.1 million or 1.9% for 9 months ended Sept 2006 to \$163.0 million compared to 9 months ended Sept 2005. This revenue growth comprises 5.9% increase at the Mechatronics Division and a decrease of 4.3% at the EMS Division, with the former representing 63.5% of the total revenue. The increase in revenue at the Mechatronics Division of \$5.7 million or 5.9% was affected by translation loss of the Euro against the Singapore Dollar. If not for this translation impact, revenue at the Mechatronics Division would have grown by 13.6%. Growth in the Mechatronics Division was from the semiconductor and medical segments with analytical segment registering a slow down. The revenue fall at the EMS Division was mainly attributable to the slow down in the office automation segment but cushioned by higher sale in the keypad business.

Similarly, the Group's PAT of \$18.8 million was affected by translation loss at the Mechatronics Division. If not for the impact on translation, the PAT for this division would have improved by 7.0% and that for the Group by 3.9%.

The Group's PAT for the 9 months ended Sept 2006 dropped \$2.0 million or 9.5% to \$18.8 million from \$20.7 million as compared to 9 months ended Sept 2005, attributable to the following factors:-

- a) There was a drop in gross profit margin from 22.9% to 21.3% attributable to margin compression of the keypad business arising from lower average selling price and lower capacity utilisation of the expanded keypad facilities. At the Mechatronics Division, the start up cost of a semiconductor project in the first quarter of 2006, the booking in of lower margins engineering projects and higher material costs affected gross margin. The drop in gross profit margin of 1.6 percentage points resulted in the decline in gross profit of \$2.0 million despite the increase in revenue of S\$3.1 million.
- b) Increase in selling and distribution expenses by \$0.1 million or 6.1% was mainly due to higher staff costs, marketing, exhibition and promotional expenses.
- c) Increase in administrative and general expenses by \$0.8 million or 10.2% was mainly due to higher staff costs, increase in professional fees and write back of staff incentive provision in 2005.
- d) Other operating expenses increased by \$0.2 million or 113.8% mainly due to foreign exchange losses from inter company balances arising from the stronger Singapore Dollar to the Malaysian Ringgit.
- e) Decrease in share of profit of an associated company by \$0.1 million as the investment was disposed off in June'06

The decrease in PAT is mitigated by:

- Lower finance costs from lower level of borrowings coupled with higher interest income from higher cumulative cash, totaling \$0.8 million; and
- ii) The lower tax expense of \$0.6 million attributable to lower pretax profits, lowering of the statutory tax rate in The Netherlands from 31.5% in 2005 to 29.6% in 2006 coupled with write back of overprovision in the previous years.

### **Balance Sheet**

There was no balance for investment in an associated company as this investment was disposed off in June 2006.

Increase in trade receivables balance by \$4.5 million was in line with the increase in sales in the Q3 2006 as compared with Q4 2005 particularly in the Mechatronics Division.

Likewise, the inventories and trade payables increases by \$4.4 million and \$3.0 million respectively were due to the increase in sale orders in the end of Q3 2006 as compared with the end of Q4 2005 particularly at the Mechatronics Division.

Decrease in bank borrowings by \$2.0 million due to repayments of bank borrowings and hire purchase during the 9 months ended Sept 2006.

### **Cash Flow Analysis**

### Q3 2006 vs Q3 2005

The group reported net cash generated from operating activities of \$7.0 million in this quarter, up from \$4.7 million previously due mainly to lower tax payment. Cash used in investing activities was lower, at \$2.4 million against \$3.0 million from lower capital expenditure and higher proceeds from disposal of assets. In this quarter cash generated from financing activities was \$0.3 million against net cash usage of \$7.3 million arising from repayment of borrowings in the same quarter last year. The combined effect of these activities resulted in the group reporting a net cash incresase of \$4.9 million in this quarter against a net cash decrease of \$5.7 million previously.

The Third Quarter of FY2006 financial results are in line with the prospect statement released in the Second Quarter of FY2006.

In the fourth quarter of FY2006, the performance of the Mechatronics Division is expected to show steady growth in the semiconductor and medical segments. The division's strong development offerings have contributed to new customers, particularly in the medical segment. Revenue from these customers is still modest, being mostly at the product initiation phase, but they are envisaged to contribute positively in the coming years. At the EMS Division, the pricing pressure on the keypad business remains a challenge but the initiatives formulated together with our customer to improve margins have been encouraging. The other segments of the division are less significant and taken together remain essentially stable.

In view of the above positive outlook, the performance of the Group is expected to be better in the fourth quarter as compared to the third quarter of 2006.
